WHITEWASH CHARGE IN 'SLUSH' INQUIRY IGNORED BY MEYER

Says Sole Interest of Committee Is to Run Down Innuences Against Lusk

Instruct Our Berlin Envoy to Negotiate Treaty For a Resumption of Diplomatic Relations

WASHINGTON, July 19.—Admission was made today in official quarters that Ellis Loring Dredel, the American Commissioner at Berlin, has been instructed to negotiate with the German Government a treaty for the resumption of diplomatic relations between the United States and German Governments. Whether these negotiations are to result in a separate treaty of peace with Germany or are to be based on the Treaty of Versailles, officials declined

Treaty of Versailles—modified and amended to relieve the United States from any "commitments" that might be objectionable. The negotiations entrusted to Commissioner Dredel are already in progress, it was said, and the likelihood exists that the American Congress and people will soon be informed whether there is to be a separate peace or President Harding still believes that the wiser course is to engage under the existing treaty.
